This method builds a list of numbers from \$start to \$end with an increment of \$inc. The optional \$format argument allows you to apply a printf style format to the numbers.

Syntax

```
string integerSelectList ( int $start, int $end, int $inc, string $tag_name,
                          string $tag_attribs, mixed $selected [, string $format] )
```

\$start is the first number on the select list.

\$end is the last number on the select list.

\$inc is the increment between successive numbers on the list.

\$tag\_name is the name attribute of the HTML <select> tag.

\$tag\_attribs is a string containing any additional attributes that you want to assign to the <select> tag.

\$selected is either a string value for a single value select list or an array for a multiple value select list.

\$format is a printf style format string to be applied to each number in the list.

Examples Example:

```
$html = mosHTML::integerSelectList( -12, 12, 1, 'tzooffset', 'size="1" class="inputbox"', 0, "%02d" );
echo $html;
```

which produces: <select name="tzooffset" size="1" class="inputbox">
